SCHOOL

Modesto Christian High School (MCHS) is a private, co-educational Christian school, jointly accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), and the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). Student enrollment is approximately 122 students in Grades 6-12. The mission of our school is to **“develop Christ-centered leaders through excellence in academics, athletics, and the arts.”**

LOCATION

Modesto is approximately 90 miles southeast of San Francisco, and 80 miles south of Sacramento. We are a growing suburban community of about 200,000 whose economy is based on agriculture and industry. Our campus is located on a thirty-one-acre site with classroom buildings, a gymnasium and athletic fields.

FACULTY

MCHS staff is made up of eighteen full and part-time teachers. The Administrative roles include Principal, Dean of Students, Athletic Director, and School Counselor. All staff hold credentials from the State of California, other states and/or certification with the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI).

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

California Scholarship Federation (CSF), National Art Honor Society (NAHS), National Honor Society, Interact Club, Drama Club, and Science Olympiad are active clubs on campus. The Associated Student Body (ASB) conducts social and extracurricular activities. All are students required to be involved on average in two activities* per year.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

COVID IMPACT

- March of 2020. Modesto Christian High School went from in person learning to distance learning until graduation in May due to the worldwide pandemic.
- Fall of 2020. From August to early November, we closed to in-person learning with students returning to the distance learning model, and then opened, for the most part, until May of 2021. When on campus, most students attended in-person learning. For students with social emotional issues, we offered a dual option. The program was limited in scope, but offered our students with social emotional support, especially seniors in jeopardy of not graduating.
- Students received letter grades for semester coursework.
- Fall of 2021. Students resumed in-person learning. All school-wide extracurricular activities resumed, as well.
- Senate Bill AB 104. Provision was given for families to request the option of Pass/No Pass marks replacing D & F grades from the previous school year. Graduation credit requirements are still being upheld.
