


The mission of Modesto Christian School (MCS) is to develop Christ-centered leaders through excellence in Academics, Athletics and the Arts. This mission and our purpose remain stronger than ever during these challenging times. We know we can provide a more excellent experience for our families by offering in-person, on-campus schooling. While the physical well-being of our students and staff is being addressed in detail later in this plan, we also know the spiritual, mental, emotional, and social well-being of your family is of utmost importance. We believe these needs are best met with in-person, on-campus learning.

This COVID-19 Safety Plan (CSP) is intended to provide guidance for our staff, students, and families. Our goal is to maximize safety for our students and staff, while providing as much on-site education for students as possible. We have developed and continue to refine our plan to provide both safety and learning continuity with a Biblical worldview for all of our students.

This CSP has been designed referencing the California Department of Public Health (CDPH): COVID-19 and Reopening In-Person Instruction Framework & Pubic Health Guidance for K-12 Schools in California, the CDC guidelines, and the Hospital for Sick Kids (SickKids) COVID-19: Recommendations for School Reopening. This plan is based on a "Healthy Only" framework for reopening the MCS campus. This framework requires the cooperation of parents and employees to ensure that only healthy individuals are permitted on campus. It is incumbent for parents and is required of all faculty and staff to inform the school in a timely manner of their awareness of symptomatic and/or positive COVID-19 results. The school facilities will receive increased levels of cleaning and sanitizing, but there would be minimal disruption to typical classroom routines. A "Healthy Only" framework provides the greatest level of normalcy, but depends on students and employees to remain at home if they display any flu-like symptoms or have been in contact with others who are symptomatic.

Modesto Christian is limiting the number of adults on campus during a few high traffic times. Our goal is to prevent gatherings and clusters of people in order to provide as normal a school day for our students as possible. Please know we are counting the days and look forward to when we can, once again, open our campus to greet and enjoy our community of parents, students, and guests!

Staff and Parent Training	All staff and parents/guardians have been provided with this COVID-19 Safety Plan (CSP), which is also published on the MCS website for ready availability. Additionally, all staff have been provided with COVID-19 Prevention Program (CPP), pursuant to Cal/OSHA standards. • Staff has undergone training on the Safety Plan's specifications, application and enforcement. • Staff has undergone training on the COVID-19 Prevention Program (Appendix D). • The Plan will be enforced with daily health screenings, and strict observance of the protocols outlined in detail in the Plan below. • Routine reminders of the most pertinent parts of the Plan are made via email, and other communications including frequent verbal reminders. • This is a living document and will be reviewed frequently and amended at any time to meet the safety needs of MCS or in the event of changes made by local, state, or federal jurisdictions.	
Daily Health Screening	Prior to arrival at school, all students, staff & volunteers must complete the Daily Health Screening Form to be allowed on campus. The form will screen for the following cold/flu-like symptoms: Temperature above 100.4 F Fever or chills Cough Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing	Independent Study students who need to be on-campus for testing or to pick up materials must complete the Daily Health Screening Form to be allowed on campus.



- Fatigue

MCS will immediately separate staff and students with ANY COVID-19 symptoms at school. MCS has a designated room strictly for ill students. Staff will complete case form: COVID\Suspected Covid19 Case Form.pdf.

Individuals who are sick must go home or to a healthcare facility depending on the severity of the symptoms. We will follow CDC guidelines for caring for those who are sick in an isolation area.

MCS will not discuss nor require disclosure of vaccination by staff or students. Staff will be trained and informed of all sick leave policies.

Arrival & Dismissal

Drop-Off

- Kindergarten and new student parents, will be permitted to accompany their student to their classroom during the first week of attendance (or longer as emotionally required).
- Grades 1-12 parents are not permitted on campus during drop-off or pick-up during carpool times. Carpools are strongly encouraged in order to reduce gatherings.
- Education on COVID-19 safety and cleaning measures, according to CDPH guidelines, are provided to carpool groups.
- Bus drivers will practice all safety actions and cleaning protocols as indicated for other staff. Bus capacity will be limited to allow for social distancing and students will be required to practice hand hygiene, and show Daily Health Screening to driver before entering the bus.

Cohorts	 Five (5) minutes before the start of school, all students will be directed to classrooms. Pick-Up During carpool/bus wait time, students will be accompanied by staff and directed to socially distance themselves. Students will remain in stable cohorts as possible throughout the school day. 	N/A
izizizizizi	 Students practice social distancing and do not share objects. Outdoor activities are prioritized. Cohorts will not change or be mixed. 	
Chapel	 Chapel will be a consistent activity in support of the spiritual, emotional, and social well-being of MCS students, even during distance learning. Chapel will be held with social distancing in place, either inside or outside as weather permits. Students remain in cohorts practicing hand hygiene. If the state/county restricts the number allowed to gather inside, the students may attend chapel on a rotating schedule or chapel will be held outside. If necessary, they will view chapel live from their classrooms via Google Meets. Chapel may be closed to guests until further notice. 	N/A
Lunch/Food Service	 PS-5th Lunch will take place in EDC, classrooms, gym, or outdoors as weather permits. 6th-12th Lunch will take place in classrooms, or outdoors as weather permits. Students will be directed to practice social distancing at the lunch tables. Students must bring their own labeled water bottles as all drinking fountains will be closed until further notice. Tables will be cleaned & sanitized by staff between servicing times. 	N/A

Academics

- All classrooms will be adequately equipped with an appropriate combination of hand sanitizer, disinfectant spray, wipes, and paper towels.
- Students will be socially distanced between 3 and 6 feet in classrooms. Classroom occupancy will be monitored to ensure social distancing.
- Teachers will be responsible for cleaning and disinfecting their classrooms each day after the students leave.
- When appropriate, students will be responsible for cleaning and disinfecting his/her own desk each day before leaving.
- Classroom doors will be kept open as much as possible to allow ventilation and airflow.
- Water fountains will not be operational.
- Students may only touch or handle their own learning materials (e.g., textbooks, pens) and will be encouraged to individually label their belongings.
- Students will be reminded to take their belongings home daily to be cleaned and disinfected.
- When sharing is allowed or necessary, learning materials will be cleaned and disinfected between uses.
- Students will be instructed not to touch another student's items - backpack, lunchbox, water bottle, etc.
- Students are required to practice social distancing wherever possible while moving with their cohort on campus.
- Teachers will provide regular hygiene training to students in order to maintain safety guidelines.
- Students remain with their assigned cohort for all activities and will have limited contact with other cohorts.

- K-5th parents will be responsible for picking up materials for the upcoming week and returning weekly completed student work Friday by 4:00 PM
- Student materials, including textbooks and workbooks, will be sent home at the beginning of the year.
- Distance Learning (in the event of school closure) -Students may join class(es) 'live' during the day via Google Meets.
- Lesson plans will be provided in order for ISP student/parent to plan Google Meets time.
- Google Classroom and FACTS/Renweb will be utilized to communicate between home and the classroom.

Pull-Out Classes



- All classrooms will be adequately equipped with an appropriate combination of hand sanitizer, disinfectant spray, wipes, and paper towels.
- Teachers will be responsible for cleaning and disinfecting their classroom between cohorts.

- Library Students may come check out books during open library times. Returned library books will be held for 2 days before returning them to the shelves.

	 Classroom doors will be kept open as much as possible to allow ventilation and airflow. Students may only touch or handle their own learning materials. PE classes will be conducted in a manner that complies with all other safety practices outlined in this plan. Returned library books will be held for 2 days before being returned to the shelves. Students remain with their assigned cohort for all activities and will have limited contact with other cohorts. On-campus music classes are not currently offered. 	PE – Google Classroom and recorded Google Meets lessons will be utilized.
Movement	 Visual markers including directional arrows, taped spaces with stenciled animals are located throughout elementary campus (only) to help students practice social distancing. Students may not linger, but must keep moving when traveling with their cohort on campus. Teachers will monitor and travel with assigned cohorts at all times. Only 2 students at a time are allowed in a bathroom. 	N/A
Recess	 Playground equipment will be sanitized between uses with GenEon Mister or other CDC approved sanitation materials. A rotation schedule will be utilized allowing cohorts access to various parts of the playground each day without mixing with other cohorts. 	N/A
Visitors & Guests	 Whenever possible, electronic business with the office/school is encouraged. Walk-ins are welcome only when necessary. All guests, parents, and visitors are required to complete a Daily Health Screening Form if remaining on campus. All guests, parents, and visitors are required to wear a mask indoors and practice social distance. Chapel may be closed to guests until further notice. 	N/A

	In conjunction with the State of CA lifting mask requirements in most settings, MCS considers masks as optional for all MCS students, faculty, staff and visitors. Unvaccinated faculty, staff and students are recommended to wear masks at their discretion.	N/A
Daycare (EDC)	 MCS recognizes that working parents have need for quality care for their student(s) before and after school, and we are pleased to continue to offer extended and enrichment classes. MCS's Extended Daycare Program (EDC) will abide by all safety guidelines for Modesto Christian School and will teach/practice social distancing. 	N/A
Miscellaneous Î	 ALL student items, including jackets, lunch boxes, water bottles, and backpacks must be labeled with the first and last name of the student. Emergency drills will be modified to maintain proper physical distancing to the greatest extent possible. Facility Cleaning &	MCS is committed to extensive cleaning and disinfecting of our	Same protocol for teachers and staff working on-campus.
Maintenance	 The COVID-19 Prevention Program (CPP), Appendix A: Identification of COVID-19 Hazards will be utilized on a daily basis. Regular inspections of the campus will be conducted using the CPP, Appendix B, in compliance with Cal/OSHA. A regular cleaning schedule will be implemented throughout the day with emphasis on high touch areas including door handles, light switches, sink handles, bathroom surfaces, tables, desks, chairs, etc. To the greatest extent possible, each classroom will be provided hand sanitizers for use by students and staff entering and exiting the room. All common areas will be provided hand sanitizers as well. To the greatest extent possible, each classroom will be provided sanitizing wipes for cleaning desks and chairs before and after use by students. 	

	 Additional janitorial services have been engaged each evening for deep cleaning. All cleaners utilized are approved for use against COVID-19 on the EPA approved list and will be used according to the directions on the label and kept away from students. A regular schedule for ventilation filter replacement will be maintained. A GenEon mister/sprayer will be utilized each evening in every PS-12 classroom and common areas. Whenever practical, fresh outdoor air will be introduced into the classroom whether by opening doors or with use of an outside air setting on the ventilation system. Inside air will be filtered and sanitized through UV Light System installed in HVAC. 	
Confirmed COVID-19 Case	In the event of a confirmed or suspected COVID-19 case on campus, we will adhere to the following protocols: Students or staff with a confirmed COVID-19 case will be asked to isolate away from campus (see "Return to School" protocol below). Staff will complete: COVID\Suspected Covid19 Case Form.pdf. MCS will conduct an internal investigation (CPP, Appendix C) to determine with whom the individual had been in close contact and to determine if any work-related factors could have contributed to risk of infection (and determine at that time any follow up in addition to the steps below) while simultaneously doing a thorough "deep cleaning" of any identified area(s) on campus. Our cleaning procedures will follow all CDC guidelines. MCS has a designated COVID-19 Response Director (Lisa Medina at lisa.medina@modestochristian.org) who will contact the Stanislaus County Public Health. MCS will work with Stanislaus County Public Health using syndromic and COVID surveillance system for case reporting and tracking.	N/A

	 Any contacts to a confirmed, positive COVID case will transfer to Independent Study for the recommended period of time per Stanislaus County Public Health. MCS will provide timely communication with families with whom the ill individual has been in contact, while maintaining privacy requirements per FERPA and HIPAA, specifically 34 CFR § 99.3. 	
Triggers for Switching to Distance Learning	 In consultation with Stanislaus County Public Health, MCS will follow School Reopening Guidance on triggers to close classrooms and in-person learning, and transition to Distance Learning. Quarantined students/cohorts will be offered the Independent Study Program. 	N/A
COVID-19 Illness "Return to School"	 In order for a student/staff who tested positive for COVID-19 to be permitted to return to campus, they must show medical confirmation in the affirmative to the following questions: Has it been at least 10 days since the individual first had symptoms? Has it been at least 1 day since the individual had a fever (without using fever-reducing medicine)? Has it been at least 3 days since the individual's symptoms have improved including cough and/or shortness of breath? Per California Department of Public Health Guidelines, a negative COVID-19 test result is not required to return to school or work. In consultation with Stanislaus County Public Health and the CSP, MCS will determine the process for return to campus. 	N/A
